*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

1 Notwithstanding any law or rule to the contrary, any em-
2 ployee of the commonwealth, who, while performing work in
3 a higher classification and being paid in that higher classifica-
4 tion shall, if he is on vacation or sick leave during such time
5 of work in a higher classification be paid vacation and/or sick
6 leave in such higher classification.
