The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR A HIGHER MINIMUM SALARY FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL TEACHERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 40 of chapter 71 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking out the first sentence, as most re-
3 cently amended by section 1 of chapter 272 of the acts of 1967,
4 and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:— The
5 compensation of every teacher employed in any public day
6 school in the commonwealth, except persons in training and
7 those employed as temporary substitutes, shall be at the rate
8 of not less than seven thousand five hundred dollars for the
9 school year.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on January first, nine-
2 teen hundred and seventy-one.

The Community of Government

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty

The first objective for a modern government is to provide a means by which the people may express their will.

It is needed by the State and Nation for the maintenance of the General Court assembled, and by the community of the world as follows:

1. Section 1. Section 10 of Chapter 11 of the Statutes of the State is hereby amended by striking out the first sentence, so that the same shall read as follows: "Section 10 of Chapter 11 of the Statutes of the State is hereby amended by striking out the following words: 'and the composition of every teacher employed in any public school in the Commonwealth, except private or denominational schools, employed as temporary substitutes, shall be as follows: (a) of not less than seven thousand five hundred dollars for the school year.'
- 1. Section 2. This act shall take effect on January first, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.
