AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL NUMBER PLATES
FOR DEAF PERSONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The sixth paragraph of section 2 of chapter 90 of the General
2 Laws, as most recently amended by section 1 of chapter 742 of
3 the acts of 1969, is hereby further amended by striking out the
4 third sentence and inserting in place thereof the following sen-
5 tence: — The registrar may also furnish plates of a distinctive
6 type or types for a pleasure passenger vehicle owned and used
7 by a blind person or a person who has suffered the loss or per-
8 manent loss of use of one or both feet, or of one or both hands,
9 and may furnish plates with the letters "D.P." to a deaf per-
10 son, and he may determine such standards of disability and of
11 qualification for the issuance of said plates as he deems proper.
