

HOUSE No. 2089

By Mr. Armstrong of Plymouth, petition of the Massachusetts Medical Society for legislation to provide that a new professional corporation shall be required to have only one director and limiting restrictions to certain officers. Commerce and Labor.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT A PROFESSIONAL CORPORATION SHALL BE REQUIRED TO HAVE ONLY ONE DIRECTOR AND LIMITING RESTRICTIONS TO CERTAIN OFFICERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 8 of chapter 156A of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out the first sentence, as appearing in
3 section 1 of chapter 654 of the acts of 1963, and inserting in
4 place thereof the following paragraph:—

5 No person shall be president, vice-president, treasurer, clerk,
6 or shareholder of a professional corporation unless he is duly
7 registered to render the same professional service as those for
8 which the corporation was organized. A professional corpora-
9 tion may be organized and continue its existence with a mini-
10 mum of one director. The same person may serve as president,
11 treasurer, clerk and director of a professional corporation.

1. All laws and regulations promulgated by the Board of Health under the authority of the Board of Health shall be subject to the review of the Board of Health and the Board of Health shall have the right to annul or amend any such law or regulation.
