## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF FOUR ADDITIONAL ASSISTANT DISTRICT ATTORNEYS FOR THE WESTERN DISTRICT AND ESTABLISHING THEIR SALARIES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 14 of chapter 12 of the General Laws is  
2 hereby amended by striking out the ninth paragraph, as appear-  
3 ing in section 1 of chapter 662 of the acts of 1966, and inserting  
4 in place thereof the following paragraph:—

5 For the western district, an assistant district attorney, two  
6 second assistant district attorneys and six third assistant dis-  
7 trict attorneys. Two of such assistants shall reside in Berkshire  
8 county and the other seven in Hampden county.

1 SECTION 2. Section 16 of said chapter 12 is hereby amended  
2 by striking out the ninth paragraph, as appearing in section 2  
3 of chapter 769 of the acts of 1969, and inserting in place thereof  
4 the following paragraph:—

5 For the western district, one assistant, ten thousand five hun-  
6 dred dollars; two assistants, nine thousand five hundred dol-  
7 lars; and six assistants, eight thousand five hundred dollars.
