AN ACT TO INCLUDE THE COMMISSIONER OF PROBATION AND THE COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC WELFARE TO THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF YOUTH SERVICES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 9 of chapter 18A of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out the first paragraph, as added by
3 section 9 of chapter 838 of the acts of 1969, and inserting in
4 place thereof the following paragraph:—

5 There shall be in the department an advisory committee
6 consisting of the commissioner of youth services, the commis-
7 sioner of mental health, the commissioner of education, the
8 commissioner of education, the commissioner of correction, the
9 commissioner of probation, the commissioner of public welfare,
10 the commissioner of rehabilitation, the chairman of the Mas-
11 sachusetts commission against discrimination, the executive
12 secretary of the Massachusetts Society for the Prevention of
13 Cruelty to Children, and the executive secretary of the Massa-
14 chusetts Committee on Children and Youth, all of whom shall
15 serve *ex officio*, and eight other persons to be appointed by the
16 governor. Such persons shall have demonstrated professional
17 involvement and expertise in the area of delinquency preven-
18 tion, rehabilitation, and treatment. Upon the expiration of the
19 term of office of any appointive member, his successor shall be
20 appointed for a term of three years. Any vacancy shall be
21 filled by the governor for the remainder of the unexpired term.
22 The governor shall appoint from the members of said com-

23 mittee a chairman and a vice chairman. The committee may
 24 appoint a full time executive secretary. Members of said com-
 25 mittee shall serve without compensation, but each member
 26 shall be reimbursed by the commonwealth for all reasonable
 27 expenses incurred in the performance of his official duties.
