AN ACT EXCEPTING COLUMBUS DAY FROM THE RESTRICTIONS OF THE  
COMMON DAY OF REST LAW.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as  
follows:*

1 Section 13 of chapter 136 of the General Laws as most re-  
2 cently amended by section 4 of chapter 24 of the acts of 1968,  
3 is hereby amended by striking out said section 13 and insert-  
4 ing in place thereof the following:—

5 *Section 13.* Applicability of section five to eleven to legal  
6 holidays:—The provisions of sections five to eleven inclusive,  
7 shall, except as provided in section fourteen, apply to all legal  
8 holidays, except the third Monday in February, the third Mon-  
9 day in April and March seventeenth and June seventeenth and  
10 October twelfth or the day following when either of said days  
11 occur on a Sunday.
