AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE COUNTIES TO ENGAGE IN PROJECTS MINIMIZING AIR OR WATER POLLUTION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:*

1 Section 14 of chapter 34 of the General Laws, as most re-  
2 cently amended by chapter 58 of the acts of 1947, is hereby  
3 further amended by adding at the end of the first paragraph  
4 the following new paragraph:—

5 The commissioners may, within their county or in conjunc-  
6 tion with the commissioners of other counties, prepare and  
7 execute projects to minimize air or water pollution, but no  
8 money shall be paid or liability incurred therefor in excess of  
9 amounts specifically authorized for specific projects by the gen-  
10 eral court.
