AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE APPORTIONMENT OF MAINTENANCE OF COUNTY TUBERCULOSIS HOSPITALS.

1 *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would tend to
2 defeat its purpose, which is to extend the time within which
3 a county shall assess cities and towns for the deficits of county
4 tuberculosis hospitals, therefore it is hereby declared to be
5 an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of
6 the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 85 of chapter 111 of the General Laws, as amended
2 by chapter 3 of 608 of the acts of 1961, is hereby further amended
3 by striking out the second sentence and inserting in place thereof
4 the following sentence:—The commissioners shall annually
5 in March apportion the balance of the cost of maintenance,
6 operation, and repair of such hospitals, including interest paid
7 or due on temporary notes issued therefor, for the previous
8 year to the cities and towns in the county in accord with their
9 evaluation as used in assessing the county taxes; and shall
10 issue their warrants against such cities and towns for the
11 amount for which they are assessed.
