

By Mr. Nordin of East Bridgewater, petition of George A. Ridder and others (county commissioners of Plymouth County) and Karl S. Nordin that said commissioners be authorized to borrow money for the alteration, construction of and additions to the Superior and probate court house in the city of Brockton, Counties.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PLYMOUTH COUNTY TO BORROW MONEY FOR ALTERATION, CONSTRUCTION OF AND ADDITIONS TO THE SUPERIOR AND PROBATE COURT HOUSE IN THE CITY OF BROCKTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The county commissioners of Plymouth county
2 are hereby authorized to alter and construct additions to the
3 Superior and Probate court house at 72 Belmont street in the
4 city of Brockton. Said commissioners may expend for the pur-
5 poses of this act such sums as may be necessary not exceeding
6 in the aggregate six hundred and fifty thousand dollars. Any
7 sums received from the Federal government for the purposes
8 of this act shall be included in as part of the total amount
9 authorized for expenditures hereunder.

1 SECTION 2. For the purposes authorized by section one, the
2 treasurer of said county, with the approval of the county com-
3 missioners, may borrow upon the credit of the county such
4 sums as may be necessary, not exceeding, in the aggregate, six
5 hundred and fifty thousand dollars and may issue bonds or
6 notes of the county thereof, which shall bear on their face the
7 words, Plymouth County Court House Loan, Act of 1970. Each
8 authorized issue shall constitute a separate loan and such
9 loans shall be payable not more than fifteen years from their
10 dates. The bonds or notes shall be signed by the county treas-

11 urer and countersigned by a majority of the county commis-
12 sioners. The county may sell the said securities at public or
13 private sale, upon such terms and conditions as the county
14 commissioners may deem proper, but not for less than their
15 par value. Indebtedness incurred hereunder shall, except as
16 herein provided, be subject to chapter thirty-five of the General
17 Laws.

1 SECTION 3. The county treasurer of said county, with the
2 approval of the county commissioners, may issue temporary
3 notes of the county, payable in not more than one year from
4 their dates, in anticipation of serial bonds or notes under this
5 act, but the time within which such serial bonds or notes shall
6 become due and payable shall not, by reason of such temporary
7 notes, be extended beyond the time fixed by this act. Any
8 notes issued in anticipation of the serial bonds or notes shall
9 be paid from the proceeds thereof.

1 SECTION 4. Said commissioners may take by eminent do-
2 main or acquire by purchase or otherwise any land that may
3 be necessary for the purposes of this act, including a sufficient
4 area for the parking of the motor vehicles of persons in at-
5 tendance upon said court. Any sums received from the federal
6 government for the purposes of this act shall be included in,
7 and considered a part of, the total amount authorized to be
8 expended hereunder.

1 SECTION 5. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
