AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION FINANCE BOARD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 92 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding
2 after section 102 the following section:—
3 *Section 103.* There shall be a finance board to the commission
4 consisting of the city manager in the case of a Plan D or E city
5 or the mayor of each other city, and the chairman of the board
6 of selectmen of each town, included in this chapter. Each
7 mayor or city manager and each chairman may, by writing
8 filed with the commission, from time to time appoint a designee
9 to act for him on the board or to act for him in exercising the
10 powers of such cities and towns. Each city and each town shall
11 have one vote on the board plus additional votes and fractions
12 thereof determined by multiplying one and one half times the
13 total number of such cities and towns by a fraction of which
14 the numerator shall be the total amount of all assessments made
15 by state treasurer to such city or town under this chapter and
16 the denominator shall be the total amount of all assessments
17 made by the state treasurer to all such cities and towns. The
18 total vote of each city and town shall each year beginning in
19 nineteen hundred and seventy be determined by the authority
20 and delivered in writing to the finance board thirty days after the
21 state treasurer has sent his warrants for payments to the cities
22 and towns. The determination of votes shall be based upon the
23 most recent annual assessment. Any action of the commission
24 relating to the expenditure of funds for construction or expan-
25 sion of any authorized activity of the commission shall be
26 subject to the approval of the finance board.
