AN ACT INCREASING THE CUMULATIVE SICK LEAVE OF CLERKS AND ASSISTANT CLERKS OF THE DISTRICT COURTS AND THE BOSTON JUVENILE COURT.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 9 of chapter 218 of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by striking out the word "ninety" where it appears  
3 and inserting in place thereof the words:—one hundred and  
4 eighty.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE

ARTICLE I

Section 1. All legislative powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for a Term of six Years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
