AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR INDEPENDENT STUDY AND WORK STUDY PROGRAMS FOR SENIORS IN HIGH SCHOOL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 4 of chapter 71 of the General Laws, as amended by
2 section 15 of chapter 572 of the acts of 1965 is hereby further
3 amended by striking out the words "fifteenth day of May" in
4 the fourteenth line, and inserting in place thereof the words:
5 —fifteenth day of April, with the exception of those students
6 engaging in work-study or independent study programs, whose
7 dismissal, on a partial or a total basis, after the first of Jan-
8 uary shall be at the discretion of the principal of the school.
