## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE RETIREMENT OF FEMALE MEMBERS OF THE CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT SYSTEM OF THE COMMONWEALTH AT INCREASED AMOUNTS WHEN THEY HAVE ATTAINED THE AGE OF FIFTY-FIVE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, any  
2 female who is a member of the contributory retirement system  
3 of the commonwealth who has attained the age of fifty-five,  
4 shall, upon application, be retired at a percentage factor of "2"  
5 instead of a percentage factor of "1.5".

### The Constitution of the United States

As the same stands after the amendments thereto

AN ACT to amend the Constitution of the United States, so far as it relates to the election of the President and Vice-President, and to the election of the electors in the several States.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America, in Congress assembled, That the Constitution of the United States, so far as it relates to the election of the President and Vice-President, and to the election of the electors in the several States, be amended in the following manner:

1. That the electors in each State shall have the power to vote for one or more persons, the number of whom shall be equal to the number of electors in that State, and to vote for as many persons as there shall be electors in that State, and that the electors in each State shall have the power to vote for one or more persons, the number of whom shall be equal to the number of electors in that State, and to vote for as many persons as there shall be electors in that State.
