AN ACT EXPANDING THE AGENDA TO BE CONSIDERED AT A PROPOSED
CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 772 of the acts of 1968 is

The Constitutionality of the Proposed

Amendment to the Constitution of the United States

As proposed by the Senate, and as amended by the House of Representatives, in the report of the Committee on Education and the Arts, dated July 1, 1870.

The proposed amendment is as follows: "The Congress shall have the power to lay and collect taxes on incomes, from whatever source derived, but not exceeding three per centum on the annual income of any individual, and five per centum on the annual income of any corporation, company, or association, in any State, Territory, or District, or in any insular possession, for the purpose of paying the interest on the public debt, and for the purpose of sinking the principal thereof, and for the purpose of carrying on the general operations of the Government."
