The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy.

AN ACT PROVIDING FACULTY REPRESENTATION ON CERTAIN
EDUCATIONAL BOARDS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 20A of chapter 15 of the General Laws
2 is hereby amended by striking out the first two paragraphs
3 and inserting in place thereof the following:—

4 There shall be a board of trustees of state colleges con-
5 sisting of three faculty members chosen by and from the
6 faculty advisory commission to the board of trustees of state
7 colleges; the chairman of the student advisory commission to
8 the board of trustees of the state colleges; and eleven other
9 members, residents of the commonwealth, to be appointed by
10 the governor, at least two of whom shall be women.

11 With the exception of the afore-mentioned faculty members
12 no person serving as a member of a board of any public
13 institution for higher education in the commonwealth or of
14 any state board of education shall be eligible for ap-
15 pointment.

1 SECTION 2. Said chapter 15 is hereby further amended by
2 inserting after section 20C the following section:—

3 *Section 20D.* There shall be a faculty advisory commission
4 to the board of trustees of state colleges consisting of one
5 elected representative from the faculty body at each of the
6 institutions under the jurisdiction of the said board. The term
7 of office of each member of said commission shall be three
8 years. No person shall be eligible to be elected to the

9 commission unless at the time of his election he is a tenured
10 member at an institution under the jurisdiction of said board.
11 If at any time during his term of office, a member of said
12 commission terminates his relationship with an institution,
13 his membership shall also be terminated and his position
14 deemed vacant. A vacancy prior to the expiration of a term
15 shall be filled for the remainder of the term by a person
16 appointed by the chairman of the commission provided that
17 the person so appointed shall be one who is a tenured
18 member at the same institution as represented by his pre-
19 decessor. The members of the commission shall elect their
20 own chairman by majority vote of the entire membership.
21 The chairman of the commission shall, from time to time, call
22 meetings of the commission. The members of the commission
23 shall serve without compensation except that they shall be
24 reimbursed for necessary expenses incurred in travelling to
25 and from commission meetings.
