

HOUSE No. 4102

By Mr. Brett of Quincy, petition of Joseph E. Brett relative to the civil service status of part time school crossing guards employed by the Metropolitan District Commission. Public Service.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE CIVIL SERVICE STATUS OF PART TIME SCHOOL CROSSING GUARDS EMPLOYED BY THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any provisions of law to the contrary, any
2 person who has served as a temporary part time school
3 crossing guard for the metropolitan district commission for
4 more than six months and who has satisfactorily passed the
5 appropriate civil service examination for the position of
6 school crossing guard shall be made permanent part time
7 employee.

1. The purpose of this act is to provide for the better regulation of the practice of medicine in this State.

THE MEDICINE ACT

AN ACT TO REGULATE THE PRACTICE OF MEDICINE IN THIS STATE.

1. The Board of Medicine shall be composed of seven members, five of whom shall be physicians and two shall be laymen.

2. The Board of Medicine shall have the honor and dignity of a Board of Medicine, and shall be organized and held in session as follows:

1. The Board of Medicine shall hold its first meeting on the first day of January, 1907.
2. The Board of Medicine shall hold its regular meetings on the first day of each month, except in the months of July and August, when the meetings shall be held on the first day of the next month.
3. The Board of Medicine shall have the power to adjourn from time to time, and to reconvene at such other times and places as it may deem proper.
4. The Board of Medicine shall have the power to elect a President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer, and such other officers and members as it may deem proper.
5. The Board of Medicine shall have the power to make and alter its rules and regulations, subject to the approval of the Legislature.
6. The Board of Medicine shall have the power to receive and hold such moneys and property as may be granted or donated to it, and to expend the same for the purposes of this act.
7. The Board of Medicine shall have the power to employ such clerical and other personnel as it may deem proper.
