RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE FEASIBILITY OF PROVIDING WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION COVERAGE FOR SEAMEN ON FISHING VESSELS WITH ITS HOME PORT IN THE COMMONWEALTH AND CERTAIN OTHER MATTERS RELATIVE THERETO.

1 *Resolved*, That a special commission, to consist of three
2 members of the senate, five members of the house of repre-
3 sentatives, the chairman of the industrial accident board or
4 his designee, and four persons to be appointed by the gover-
5 nor, one of whom shall be a representative of the insurance
6 industry, one of whom shall be a representative of the owners
7 of fishing vessels and one of whom shall be a representative
8 of the seamen employed on fishing vessels, is hereby estab-
9 lished for the purpose of making an investigation and study
10 relative to the feasibility of providing workmen's compensa-
11 tion coverage for seamen on fishing vessels with its home port
12 in the commonwealth and certain other matters relative to
13 thereto which it deems relevant and proper. Said commission
14 may travel without the commonwealth and Canada.
