

By Mr. Walsh of Boston, petition of Joseph B. Walsh and George V. Kenneally, Jr., relative to prohibiting the granting of additional racing dates at running horse race meetings. Government Regulations.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT NO ADDITIONAL RACING DATES BE GRANTED TO RACE TRACKS THAN ORIGINALLY APPLIED FOR.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 128A of the General Laws, as most
2 recently amended, is hereby further amended by striking out
3 paragraph (f) and inserting in place thereof the following: —

4 (f) No licenses shall be issued for more than an aggregate of
5 ninety racing days in any one year at all running horse race
6 meetings combined, not including running horse racing meetings
7 at state and county fairs. The days shall be restricted to the
8 amount applied for in the original application and no further
9 dates shall be granted by the commission.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter 125A of the General Laws, as most
2 recently amended, is hereby further amended by striking out
3 paragraph (g) and inserting in place thereof the following: —

4 (g) No licenses shall be issued for more than an aggregate of
5 two hundred racing days in any one year at all dog racing
6 meetings combined, not including dog racing meetings at state
7 and county fairs. The days shall be restricted to the amount
8 applied for in the original application and no further dates shall
9 be granted by the commission.
