The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT EACH MEMBER OF THE GENERAL COURT
SHALL HAVE AN OFFICE AND CLERICAL ASSISTANCE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

- 1 Each member of the general court shall be provided with
- 2 suitable office space and with one clerical assistant, subject to
- 3 an appropriation of funds therefor.

For the purpose of the present bill, the term "State" shall include the District of Columbia and the Territory of Alaska.

The Constitution of the United States

Article I, Section 8, Clause 3
