## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE TRANSFER OF THE MASSACHUSETTS BAY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY, THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION, AND THE METROPOLITAN AIR POLLUTION CENTRAL DISTRICT TO COUNTY GOVERNMENT.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding the contrary provisions of any general or  
2 special law, all the powers and duties conferred upon the Massa-  
3 chusetts Bay Transportation Authority, the metropolitan dis-  
4 trict commission, and the metropolitan air pollution central  
5 district shall be transferred and vested in the county commis-  
6 sioners of the counties of Suffolk, Middlesex and Norfolk. Said  
7 commissioners shall exercise exclusive central control and au-  
8 thority over all programs for the abatement of air, water, and  
9 noise pollution.

## The Constitution of the State

Section 1. The Executive Power shall be vested in the Governor.
