## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE FIRST DISTRICT COURT OF ESSEX AT SALEM AND THE THIRD DISTRICT COURT OF ESSEX AT IPSWICH SHALL HAVE CONCURRENT JURISDICTION OVER THE TOWNS OF HAMILTON AND WENHAM.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 218 of the General Laws is  
2 hereby amended by striking out the first paragraph under the  
3 caption "Essex", as appearing in the Tercentenary Edition, and  
4 inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:—

5 The first district court of Essex, held at Salem, Beverly,  
6 Danvers, Hamilton, Middleton, Topsfield, Wenham and Man-  
7 chester, the third district court of Essex exhibiting concurrent  
8 jurisdiction in Hamilton and Wenham.

1 SECTION 2. Said section 1 of said chapter 218 is hereby further  
2 amended by striking out the third paragraph under the caption  
3 "Essex", as appearing in the Tercentenary Edition, and insert-  
4 ing in place thereof the following paragraph:—

5 The third district court of Essex, held at Ipswich, Hamilton,  
6 and Wenham; the first district court of Essex exhibiting con-  
7 current jurisdiction in Hamilton and Wenham.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES
