AN ACT LOWERING THE AGE AT WHICH THE MARRIAGE OF A MALE
MAY BE SOLEMNIZED WITHOUT PARENTAL CONSENT.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

- 1 Section 7 of chapter 207 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by striking out in line three the word "twenty-one"
- 3 and substituting therefor the word:—eighteen.
