AN ACT TO ESTABLISH AN OFFICIAL STENOGRAPHER IN THE PROBATE COURT OF NORFOLK COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 18 of chapter 215 of the General Laws, as most re-
2 cently amended by chapter 631 of the acts of 1964, is hereby
3 further amended by adding the following two sentences:—
4 The judges of probate of Norfolk county shall appoint an
5 official stenographer. Such official stenographer shall receive
6 from said county such salary as shall be established from time
7 to time by the judges of the probate court for Norfolk county,
8 with the approval of the justices of the supreme judicial court.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year of the Lord 1880

- 1 Section 19 of chapter 212 of the General Laws, as amended by
- 2 chapter 409B, enacted by the vote of the Senate and House of Representatives
- 3 in conference on the 15th day of March, 1879, is hereby amended
- 4 so that the same shall read as follows, to-wit:
- 5 The judges of probate of Norfolk county shall receive an
- 6 official stenographer, such official stenographer shall receive
- 7 a fee of ten dollars per annum, to be paid by the county, and shall
- 8 be appointed by the judges of probate and for Norfolk county
- 9 with the approval of the judges of the superior judicial court
