AN ACT AUTHORIZING OFFICERS SERVING IN CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTIONS TO ADJUST THEIR REGULARLY ASSIGNED DAYS OFF IN ORDER TO FULFILL THEIR MILITARY OBLIGATIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the
2 commissioner of correction shall promulgate rules and regu-
3 lations which shall permit officers serving at correctional
4 institutions to make reasonable arrangements to adjust their
5 regularly assigned days off so that they may fulfill their
6 military obligations, whether for active or reserve duty.

The Commission of Enquiry
