AN ACT ESTABLISHING A RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT FOR RECIPIENTS OF PUBLIC WELFARE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1 of chapter 117 of the General Laws, as most re-
2 cently amended by section 8 of chapter 658 of the acts of 1967,
3 is hereby further amended by striking out, in line 3, the words
4 "residing or found therein", and inserting in place thereof the
5 words: — who has resided therein for at least one year.

1. Section 1 of chapter 117 of the General Laws of the State of West Virginia, as amended by section 2 of chapter 122 of the acts of 1907, is hereby further amended by striking out the words "and the coal-mining industry in the State of West Virginia" and inserting in their stead the words "and the coal-mining industry in the State of West Virginia" who has worked therein for at least one year.
