The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE PORT OF BOSTON BY THE MASSACHUSETTS PORT AUTHORITY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

1 The fourth paragraph of section 6 of chapter 465 of the acts
2 of 1956 is hereby amended by adding at the end of the first
3 sentence thereof the following words:—in conjunction with a
4 planning board composed of one representative from Boston
5 major to be appointed by the mayor, one representative from
6 East Boston to be appointed by their APAC office, one repre-
7 sentative from South Boston to be appointed by their APAC
8 office, one representative from the Longshoreman's union, and
9 two representatives from the shipping companies.

It is the duty of the House of Representatives to inquire into the conduct of the Executive and to report thereon to the Senate. It is also the duty of the House to impeach and to try the President, Vice President, and all civil Officers and Ministers of the United States who may be impeached.

The Constitution of the United States

Article I, Section 5, Clause 2

When the House is on the trial of any civil Officer, the Senate shall be on the trial of the same. The Senate shall have the sole and exclusive Power of Impeachment.

The Senate shall have the sole and exclusive Power of trying all Impeachments. When sitting for that Purpose, they shall be on Oath or Affirmation. The Oath or Affirmation shall be administered by the Chief Justice of the United States.

The Senate shall have the sole and exclusive Power of judging of the Impeachments, and the Punishment thereon, and no Impeachment shall work any Absence of the Officer tried. But the Judgment of the Senate shall not extend further than to removal from Office, and disqualification to hold any Office under the United States, but the Party impeached shall nevertheless be capable of being re-elected or appointed to any Office which he had before the Impeachment. The Senate shall have the sole and exclusive Power to expel Members from either House, and no Expulsion shall affect the Validity of any Act previously done by that House, or by any Member thereof.
