RESOLVE INCREASING THE SCOPE OF THE SPECIAL COMMISSION ESTABLISHED TO MAKE AND INVESTIGATION AND STUDY RELATIVE TO HUNGER AND MALNUTRITION IN THE COMMONWEALTH AND CERTAIN RELATED MATTERS.

Resolved, That the special commission, established by chapter sixty-four of the resolves of nineteen hundred and sixty-nine and revived and continued by chapter three of the resolves of nineteen hundred and seventy, shall, in the course of its investigation and study, consider the subject matter of current house documents numbered 3045, requiring public school authorities to permit pupils to eat lunch on school premises; and 3241, eliminating food as a reimbursable expenditure of cities, towns and districts for support of a public school.
