RESOLUTIONS CONGRATULATING THE CITY OF HAVERHILL ON THE OCCASION OF ITS ONE HUNDREDTH ANNIVERSARY.

1 *Whereas*, Haverhill, founded in 1640, was incorporated as a
2 city in 1870 and is celebrating its one hundredth Anniversary of
3 its incorporation during the current year; and

4 *Whereas*, This thriving community, the leading manufacturing
5 center of women's shoes, has produced in addition over the years
6 many famous products such as machine tools, shoe machinery,
7 leather, plastics, clothing, food products, laminated paper and
8 sewing machines but to name a few; and

9 *Whereas*, Haverhill, the birthplace of the famous Quaker poet,
10 John Greenleaf Whittier, has been the home of many other
11 distinguished citizens and its inhabitants have contributed
12 immeasurably to the growth and development of the economy of
13 the commonwealth; and

14 *Whereas*, The celebration of the One hundredth Anniversary of
15 the city of Haverhill is of great significance not only to the
16 inhabitants of the city but also to the commonwealth at large;
17 therefore be it

18 *Resolved*, That the Massachusetts House of Representatives
19 hereby extends to the City of Haverhill its congratulations and
20 best wishes for a prosperous future; and be it further

21 *Resolved*, That copies of these resolutions be forwarded by the
22 Secretary of the Commonwealth to the City Clerk of the city of
23 Haverhill to be filed with the records of said City.
