RESOLUTIONS MEMORIALIZING THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES NOT TO ENACT LEGISLATION REMOVING STATUTORY AUTHORITY FOR THE EXISTENCE OF THE SELECTED RESERVE OF THE COAST GUARD.

1     *Whereas*, The President of the United States, in his Budget  
2 message to the Congress for fiscal year 1971, has requested  
3 funds sufficient only to phase out the Selected Reserve of the  
4 Coast Guard; and

5     *Whereas*, The President has forwarded legislation to the Con-  
6 gress of the United States which would, if enacted, specifically  
7 remove statutory authority for the existence of the Selected  
8 Reserve of the Coast Guard; and

9     *Whereas*, The Coast Guard Reserve has, since its esta-  
10 blishment during World War II, contributed greatly to the  
11 defense effort of the nation, particularly in its military pre-  
12 paredness for the protection of its ports; therefore be it

13     *Resolved*, That the Massachusetts House of Representatives  
14 respectfully urges the Congress of the United States not to  
15 enact legislation that would remove the statutory authority for  
16 the existence of the Selected Reserve of the Coast Guard; and  
17 be it further

18 *Resolved*, That copies of these resolutions be transmitted  
19 forthwith by the Secretary of the Commonwealth to the Pre-  
20 sident of the United States, the presiding officer of each  
21 branch of the Congress and to the members thereof from this  
22 Commonwealth.
