AN ACT AUTHORIZING EMPLOYMENT OF CERTAIN MINORS BETWEEN  
THE AGES OF SIXTEEN AND EIGHTEEN IN INDUSTRY WHILE  
ATTENDING SCHOOL.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as  
follows:*

1 Chapter 149 of the General Laws is hereby amended by  
2 inserting after section 95 the following section:— *Section 95A.*  
3 A school committee of any city, town or regional school district  
4 which accepts the provisions of this section, may permit a minor  
5 over sixteen and under eighteen who is attending school to be  
6 employed in industry without the certificate required by section  
7 ninety-five; provided, however, that such minor is part of a  
8 cooperative work study program operated by said school  
9 committee and approved by the department of education. Said  
10 minor, while so employed, shall be subject to the provisions of  
11 chapter one hundred and fifty-two.
