RESOLUTIONS COMMENDING JOSEPH W. TUTTLE OF FRAMINGHAM.

1 *Whereas*, Friends and neighbors of Joseph W. Tuttle are
2 joining together in the current year, to celebrate with him his
3 Fiftieth Anniversary in the practice of law; and

4 *Whereas*, Blinded by gunshot at the age of 15 in 1909,
5 Joseph W. Tuttle met the challenge of this adversity with
6 courage and determination and graduated from Bowdoin Col-
7 lege in 1917, Harvard Law School in 1920, and was admitted
8 to the practice of law in the same year; and

9 *Whereas*, Joseph W. Tuttle served with distinction as a
10 Representative of the 8th Middlesex House District from 1931
11 through 1936 and during this period of devoted public service
12 won the confidence and respect of his associates and those
13 with whom he came in contact; and

14 *Whereas*, Joseph W. Tuttle is recognized by his brother law-
15 yers as an able, aggressive and fair adversary in all legal matters;

17 *Whereas*, The determination and success of Joseph W. Tuttle
18 is an inspiration to his friends and neighbors and reflects great
19 credit on his family; therefore be it

20 *Resolved*, That the Massachusetts House of Representatives
21 extends to Joseph W. Tuttle its congratulations on the Fiftieth
22 Anniversary of his practice of law in the commonwealth and
23 best wishes for good health and continued success in all his
24 endeavors; and be it further

25 *Resolved*, That a copy of these resolutions be forwarded by
26 the Secretary of the Commonwealth to Joseph W. Tuttle.
