## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT NO FEE SHALL BE CHARGED FOR THE REGISTRATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES OWNED BY POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 33 of chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by striking out the fourth paragraph, as appearing  
3 in section 1 of chapter 421 of the acts of 1963, and inserting  
4 in place thereof the following paragraph: —

5 For the registration of every motor vehicle and trailer  
6 owned by any political subdivision of the commonwealth, and  
7 used solely for official business, no fee shall be collected here-  
8 under.
