RESOLVE IN FAVOR OF J. J. COLLINS.

1 *Resolved*, That for the purpose of discharging a moral obli-  
2 gation of the commonwealth, there shall be allowed and paid  
3 out of the state treasury, to J. J. Collins of Marblehead the  
4 sum of ten thousand five hundred dollars as reimbursement  
5 for legal expenses incurred by him in defense of criminal  
6 charges brought against him arising out of his official con-  
7 duct as an employee of the department of public works, of  
8 which charges he was found not guilty in Norfolk superior  
9 court in April, nineteen hundred and sixty-six.

The Constitution of the United States

As amended by the Thirteenth, Fourteenth, Fifteenth, and Nineteenth Amendments

ARTICLE I

Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State.

Section 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for a Term of six Years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators in that State.
