AN ACT PROVIDING A STATE SUBSIDY FOR MUNICIPALLY AND PRIVATELY OWNED NURSING SCHOOLS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The commonwealth shall annually reimburse cities and towns
- 2 one quarter of the annual net cost of operating municipally
- 3 and privately owned nursing schools.

The Senate of the United States

is the body which exercises the legislative power

1. The Senate is composed of two Senators from each State and two Senators from the District of Columbia.
2. The Senators are elected by the people of the States for a term of six years.
3. The Senate is organized into three classes, one of which expires every two years.
4. The Senate elects its own officers, including a President and a Vice-President.
5. The Senate has the power to impeach and try federal judges and officers.
6. The Senate has the power to ratify and reject treaties and appointments.
7. The Senate has the power to confirm and reject appointments.
