### AN ACT FOR LABOR REPRESENTATION ON HOUSING AUTHORITIES

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 The first paragraph of Section 26L of Chapter 121 of the  
2 General Laws is amended by adding the following to the last  
3 sentence of said first paragraph: — “and the appointment of  
4 the representative of organized labor shall be made by the  
5 mayor from a list of three or more names submitted by the  
6 Central Labor Council, AFL-CIO of the city.”
