By Mr. Weeks, a petition of Robert L. Anderson for legislation to authorize the district attorney for the Plymouth District to appoint three special assistant district attorneys. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY FOR THE PLYMOUTH DISTRICT TO APPOINT THREE SPECIAL ASSISTANT DISTRICT ATTORNEYS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 12 of the General Laws is hereby amended by in-
2 serting after section 20B the following section:

3 Section 20C. The district attorney for the Plymouth district
4 may appoint three attorneys-at-law to serve as special assistant
5 district attorneys and may remove them at pleasure. Such
6 special assistants shall have all the powers of assistant district
7 attorneys, and shall receive from the commonwealth such sal-
8 ary, not exceeding six thousand dollars, as the district attorney
9 may determine.

By the Senate a resolution was passed on February 12, 1903, providing for the appointment of a committee to investigate the conduct of the various departments of the Government, and to report thereon to the Senate at the next session of the Senate.

The Government of the Republic

AN ACT APPROVED: THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, AND THE JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT TO APPOINT THREE SENATORS, AND TO APPOINT THREE JUDGES.

Section 1. The Senate and House of Representatives, and the Judicial Department, are hereby authorized, and they are hereby directed, to appoint three Senators, and three Judges, as follows:

1. Senator 1st in the District of Columbia is hereby authorized to be appointed by the Senate.
2. Senator 2nd in the District of Columbia is hereby authorized to be appointed by the Senate.
3. Senator 3rd in the District of Columbia is hereby authorized to be appointed by the Senate.
4. Judge 1st in the District of Columbia is hereby authorized to be appointed by the Senate.
5. Judge 2nd in the District of Columbia is hereby authorized to be appointed by the Senate.
6. Judge 3rd in the District of Columbia is hereby authorized to be appointed by the Senate.
7. The Senate and House of Representatives, and the Judicial Department, are hereby authorized to do all things necessary and proper to carry out the purposes of this Act.
8. This Act shall take effect on the day of its passage.
