AN ACT GRANTING DISCRETION TO SCHOOL COMMITTEES IN THE
MATTER OF CHARGING TUITION FOR CHILDREN TEMPORARILY RESID-
ING IN A TOWN.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 6A of chapter 71 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by adding the following sentence: — How-
3 ever, the school committee may vote to waive all or part of
4 such tuition charge.

1 SECTION 2. Section 6 of chapter 76 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by adding the following sentence: — The
3 school committee of the town in which a child is temporarily
4 residing for the special purpose of their attending school may
5 waive tuition in full or in part for such child.
