AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE REGISTRATION  
OF COMMERCIAL VEHICLES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Section 2 of Chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by striking out paragraph (b), as amended and in-
- 3 serting in place thereof the following paragraph:
- 4 If the registrar shall determine at any time that, for any
- 5 reason, a motor vehicle or trailer is unsafe or improperly
- 6 equipped or otherwise unfit to be operated, he may refuse to
- 7 register such motor vehicle or trailer, or if it is already reg-
- 8 istered, may suspend or revoke its registration. The registra-
- 9 tion of every motor vehicle and trailer registered under this
- 10 section shall expire at midnight on December thirty-first of
- 11 each year except commercial motor vehicles which chose to
- 12 have their registrations expire on July first of each year.

1. Section 2 of Chapter 10 of the Revised Code is hereby amended by striking out therefrom the words "and the District of Columbia" and inserting therefor the words "and the District of Columbia and the Territory of Alaska".

If the auditor shall find that any of the funds of the State are being expended for any purpose other than that authorized by law, he shall report the same to the Commission, and the Commission shall cause an investigation to be made of the same, and if it shall be found that any of the funds have been so expended, the Commission shall report the same to the Governor, and the Governor shall cause the same to be repaid to the State.
