AN ACT TO PROVIDE COMPENSATION OF MEDICAL CONSULTANTS
IN STATE SERVICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 7 of chapter 268A of the General Laws, as amended
2 by chapter 446 of the acts of 1968, is hereby further amended
3 by adding the following paragraph:—

4 This section shall not apply to any physician or dentist,
5 registered under chapter one hundred and twelve, and who is
6 filling a temporary or permanent position established by the
7 director of personnel and standardization, provided that no
8 such physician or dentist shall receive compensation from the
9 commonwealth for such service if he also receives compensa-
10 tion for such service from a medical service corporation or
11 any other source.
