## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE RESIGNATION OF MUNICIPAL OFFICERS SHALL NOT BECOME EFFECTIVE UNTIL FILED WITH THE CLERK OF THE MUNICIPALITY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 109 of chapter 41 of the General Laws, as most  
2 recently amended by chapter 54 of the acts of 1964, is hereby  
3 further amended by striking out the first sentence and insert-  
4 ing in place thereof the following sentence: — No resignation  
5 of a town or district officer shall be deemed effective unless  
6 and until such resignation is filed with the town or district  
7 clerk, or such later time certain as may be specified in such  
8 resignation.
