## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy.

AN ACT PROVIDING TENURE OF OFFICE UNTIL AGE SEVENTY FOR SIDNEY GARDINER, INCUMBENT OF THE POSITION OF DEPUTY COLLECTOR IN THE HOSPITAL DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF QUINCY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 The tenure of office of Sidney Gardiner, incumbent of the  
2 position of deputy collector in the hospital department of the  
3 city of Quincy, shall be unlimited during good behavior until  
4 he attains age seventy, but he may be removed therefrom  
5 under the provisions of section forty-three of chapter thirty-  
6 two of the General Laws.
