The following is a copy of Article 11 as it appeared on the Warrant for the Annual Town Meeting March 7, 1970:

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to petition the Legislature for legislation to repeal the vote of the Town of February 2, 1942 which placed the office of Superintendent of Streets within the classified civil service, or take any action in relation thereto.

Action taken at Annual Town Meeting:

ARTICLE 11. Moved and seconded to authorize the Selectmen to petition the Legislature for legislation to repeal the vote of the Town of February 2, 1942 which placed the office of Superintendent of Streets within the classified civil service. So voted unanimously.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE OFFICE OF SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS OF THE TOWN OF RUTLAND SHALL NOT BE SUBJECT TO THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The office of superintendent of streets of the
2 town of Rutland shall not be subject to the provisions of
3 chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall be submitted for acceptance to the
2 voters of said town at the annual town meeting in the year
3 nineteen hundred and seventy-one in the form of the following
4 question, which shall be placed upon the official ballot to be
5 used for the election of town officers at said meeting: — "Shall
6 an act passed by the General Court in the year nineteen
7 hundred and seventy, entitled 'An act providing that the office
8 of superintendent of streets of the town of Rutland shall not
9 be subject to the civil service law', be accepted?" If a majority
10 of the votes in answer to said question is in the affirmative,
11 then this act shall thereupon take full effect, but not other-
12 wise.
