AN ACT DEFINING THE INVESTIGATING COMMISSIONER'S FUNCTION WITH RESPECT TO COMPLAINTS OF HOUSING DISCRIMINATION FILED WITH THE MASSACHUSETTS COMMISSION AGAINST DISCRIMINATION AGAINST NON-RESIDENT RESPONDENTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The eleventh sentence of the second paragraph of section 5
2 of chapter 151B of the General Laws, as appearing in chapter
3 727 of the acts of 1968, is hereby amended by striking out the
4 work "a hearing" in line one and inserting in place thereof: —
5 an investigating, and by striking out the word "hearing" in line
6 five and inserting in place thereof: — investigating.
