

Accompanying the first recommendation of the Health, Welfare and Retirement Trust Funds Board (House, No. 126). Commerce and Labor.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-One.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE NAMES OF EACH EMPLOYEE, THE CONTRIBUTIONS GIVEN OR OWED AND THE HOURS WORKED BY EACH EMPLOYEE SHALL BE REPORTED FOR HEALTH, WELFARE AND RETIREMENT FUNDS PURPOSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 151D of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 adding the following section: —
3 *Section 11:* Any employer, and the president, secretary and
4 treasurer, or officers exercising corresponding functions of a
5 corporation which is an employer, who is party to an agree-
6 ment to pay or provide the contributions covered by this
7 chapter, or who is required to pay such contributions under
8 the terms of sections twenty-six and twenty-seven of chapter
9 one hundred and forty-nine, shall report the names of all
10 employees of such employer who are covered by the agree-
11 ment, the contributions given or owed, and the hours worked
12 by such employees to the Health, Welfare and Retirement
13 Trust Funds Board within thirty days after demand by the
14 Health, Welfare and Retirement Trust Funds Board by written
15 notice served by certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt
16 requested. In addition to any other penalty or punishment
17 prescribed by law, whoever refuses, knowingly fails or grossly
18 neglects to report such names, hours and contributions within
19 thirty days after said written request shall be punished by a
20 fine of not less than ten nor more than fifty dollars or by
21 imprisonment in a jail or house of correction for not more
22 than two months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
