AN ACT INCLUDING PORTABLE OR DEMOUNTABLE CLASSROOMS
WITHIN THE DEFINITIONS OF AN "APPROVED SCHOOL PROJECT"
UNDER THE SCHOOL BUILDING ASSISTANCE LAW.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

1 Section 5 of chapter 645 of the acts of 1948, as amended, is
2 hereby further amended by striking out in the first sentence
3 the definition of "Approved school project" and inserting in
4 place thereof the following sentence: — "Approved school
5 project" shall mean any project for the construction or enlarge-
6 ment of a regional, consolidated or county agricultural school,
7 or of any public schoolhouse, including a modular, portable or
8 demountable schoolroom or rooms, in any city or town, and
9 shall include the original equipment and furnishings, whether
10 movable or built in, to complete said project, the contract or
11 contracts for which shall have been awarded on or after Janu-
12 ary first, nineteen hundred and forty-six, by any city, town,
13 county or regional school building committee, which has been
14 approved by the commission for the purposes of sections 7 to
15 9, inclusive.
