AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF BEDFORD TO APPROPRIATE MONEY ANNUALLY IN ANTICIPATION OF THE CELEBRATION OF THE TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF SAID TOWN.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The town of Bedford may appropriate money
2 annually from and including the year nineteen hundred seventy
3 to and including the year nineteen hundred seventy-nine for
4 the celebration of the two hundred and fiftieth anniversary of
5 the town of Bedford.

1 SECTION 2. Said town may establish in the town treasury a
2 special fund in which shall be deposited such sums as may be
3 appropriated by the town for said celebration, and any and all
4 such sums received by the town treasurer shall be kept separate
5 and apart from all other funds of the town, and the principal
6 and interest thereof, may, from time to time, be expended for
7 the purposes of said celebration by or upon the authorization
8 of the board of selectmen, and any surplus remaining in said
9 special fund after said celebration is concluded shall be trans-
10 ferred by said treasurer into the treasury of the town.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AS PASSED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, MARCH 18, 1871.

SECTION 1. The laws of the State relating to the sale of public lands, and the manner of disposing of the same, are hereby revised and amended, and the provisions of the laws so revised and amended are hereby enacted into laws.

SECTION 2. And it is the policy of the State to sell the public lands at the lowest price for which they can be sold, and to sell them in small tracts, and to sell them in such a manner as to secure the greatest amount of revenue to the State, and to secure the greatest benefit to the people.
