AN ACT ESTABLISHING SAFETY MEASURES FOR THE DEBARKATION AND EMBARKATION OF CERTAIN SCHOOL CHILDREN ON SCHOOL BUSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
- 2 inserting after section 7L the following section:—
- 3 *Section 7M.* The school committee of every town shall
- 4 either appoint an attendant, twenty-one years of age or over,
- 5 to assist the driver of a school bus transporting twenty-five or
- 6 more children, some of whom are ten years of age or under in
- 7 supervising the embarkation and debarkation of said children
- 8 ten years of age or under or shall direct the operator of such a
- 9 school bus to bring said school bus to a complete halt and
- 10 shut off the motor when embarking or debarking said chil-
- 11 dren ten years of age or under and personally escort said
- 12 children to and from the sidewalk or safety loading zone.

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A BOARD OF SUPERVISORS FOR THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN SAID DISTRICT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the following be and they are hereby enacted into laws: Section 1. That the Board of Supervisors of the District of Columbia shall be composed of five members, to be appointed by the President of the United States, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate.

2. That the Board of Supervisors shall have the honor and authority to call before them any person who may be deemed necessary to the discharge of their duties, and to examine him or her on oath touching any matter which may be brought before them.
3. That the Board of Supervisors shall have the honor and authority to make and publish a report of their proceedings, and of the state of the public schools in the District of Columbia, at the end of each year.
