AN ACT PROVIDING FOR AN ANNUITY FOR WIDOWS WHOSE SPOUSES WERE RETIRED FOR ORDINARY DISABILITY UNDER THE CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
- 2 inserting after section 101 the following section:—
- 3 *Section 101A.* In the event of the death of any former
- 4 employee who had been retired for ordinary disability under
- 5 the provisions of this chapter under which retirement he was
- 6 unable to provide for any annual benefits to be paid to his
- 7 widow at the time of his death, there shall be paid to such
- 8 widow an annual allowance in the amount of twelve hundred
- 9 dollars, for as long as she remains unmarried; provided, that
- 10 any benefit payable under this section shall be in the alterna-
- 11 tive to any benefit to which such widow would be entitled
- 12 under the provisions of any other section of this chapter.

The Constitution of the Republic

Article I, Section 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.
The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
No Representative shall be chosen for a Term longer than two Years, but he shall be eligible for Re-election immediately after the Expiration of such Term, and he shall, when elected, be in the full Possession of his Civil Rights.
