AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE RETIREMENT RIGHTS OF CERTAIN VETERANS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 58 of chapter 32 of the General Laws, as appearing
2 in section 1 of chapter 700 of the acts of 1968, is hereby
3 amended by striking out, in line 3, the word "thirty" and
4 inserting in place thereof the word: — twenty-five.
